

Winter Scholarships:

Atlantic Towing Scholarship

Atlantic Towing is part of the J. D. Irving Group of Companies with operations including servicing and development in the offshore industries off Newfoundland and the Maritime Provinces of Canada. The company has had a long-standing relationship with the Memorial University Fisheries and Marine Institute working as a key partner in work term placement and graduate employment of our seafaring students. The scholarship will be awarded two times per year, one scholarship in the Fall and one in the Spring scholarship ceremony.

The Fall scholarship recipient will be a Nautical Science Student who has completed their first year - students must meet the general scholarship eligibility criteria and must be a resident of New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island or Newfoundland and Labrador. Initial preference for both scholarships will be given to students who have completed a work term with Atlantic Towing, but if that criteria cannot be met the scholarship will be awarded based on the above criteria, but excluding work term location.

Canadian Coast Guard Newfoundland Region Alumni Association Scholarship in Maritime Studies

This Scholarship was established by the Canadian Coast Guard Newfoundland Region Alumni Association, a non-profit organization dedicated to supporting scholarships, outreach, art and education and the preservation of maritime heritage. In addition, this Scholarship reflects the alumni group members' own careers and those of their colleagues. Valued at \$500 annually, the Scholarship will be awarded to a full-time student at the Fisheries and Marine Institute of Memorial University of Newfoundland who is in a Technical Certificate program (Bridge Watch or Marine Diesel Mechanics) or in the first year of study in a Diploma of Technology program (Nautical Science or Marine Engineering). The scholarship will alternate annually between a Technical Certificate student and a Diploma of Technology student as described above. The first round of selection will be awarded to a Diploma of Technology Student (Nautical Science or Marine Engineering). Recipients must meet minimum academic requirements for a scholarship as defined by the University. Preference will be given to a student with financial need. The Scholarship will be awarded by the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee.

Canadian Federation of University Women St. John's Marine Institute Scholarship

This Scholarship was established the Canadian Federation of University Women (CFUW) St. John's, an organization committed to promoting equality for women and girls. It will be awarded annually to women who are enrolled in full-time studies at the Fisheries and Marine Institute of Memorial University of Newfoundland.

The number and value of the scholarships are determined on a year by year basis by the CFUW Scholarship Committee. The recipient must have graduated from a high school in Newfoundland and Labrador and meet the minimum academic requirements for the Scholarship as defined by the university. The Scholarship will be awarded by the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee.

Canadian Institute of Marine Engineers (NL Branch) Scholarship

The Canadian Institute of Marine Engineers (NL Branch) Scholarship endowment fund was established through matched gifts from the Canadian Institute of Marine Engineers (National) and the Canadian Institute of Marine Engineers (NL Branch). The establishment of this endowment follows a long history of recognizing and celebrating marine engineering student success at the Marine Institute, dating back to a Canadian Institute of Marine Engineers prize that was established in 1965 at the College of Fisheries, Navigation, Marine Engineering and Electronics.

Valued at a portion of the income on the endowment the scholarship will be given annually at the Marine Institute Winter/Spring scholarship ceremony to a fulltime student with scholarship standing studying beyond first year in the Marine Engineering Program or the Marine Engineering Systems Design Program. The scholarship will be awarded alternately between these programs. The scholarship will be awarded by the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee.

Dale Howse, Sterling Perham, and Richard Price Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship in memory of three students is presented to a student enrolled in a technology program. Preference may be given to a student in the Marine Engineering program.

Dr. Aidan Maloney Scholarship in Fisheries Resource Management

The Dr. Aidan Maloney Scholarship in Fisheries (Resource Management) was established through a generous gift by Dr. Aidan Maloney, who served the fishery of Newfoundland and Labrador in both the private and public sectors for almost 50 years.

This scholarship, valued at a portion of the income on the endowment, will be given annually to a full-time graduate student enrolled in the Master of Marine Studies – Fisheries Resource Management program at the Marine Institute. If the above criteria cannot be satisfied, second preference will go to a full-time graduate student conducting fisheries related research in the Centre for Fisheries Ecosystems Research.

Dr. Heather Carnahan Graduate Scholarship in Maritime Studies

This Scholarship was established by a generous donation from Dr. Gary Kachanoski, 12th President and Vice-Chancellor of Memorial University, together with a circle of friends, family, and colleagues of Dr. Heather Carnahan. This memorial endowment honors her visionary leadership and pioneering research that paved the way for expanding knowledge in the area of human factors and safety with the view to advancing working conditions. Her career spanned over 30 years as a researcher - studying how people learn, develop, and become experts in the fine motor skills needed to be fishermen, mariners, and surgeons. In 2021 Dr. Carnahan was appointed the Lockheed Martin Industrial Research Chair in Simulation and Learning at the Marine Institute, leading a team of graduate students studying the effective design and use of simulators as learning tools for maritime industries. In 2022 Dr. Carnahan was recognized as University Research Professor, the most prestigious award Memorial University gives to faculty for research, consistently high level of scholarship, and graduate supervision and mentoring. She was the first researcher at the Marine Institute to receive this award. Valued at a portion of the income on the endowment, it will be awarded annually to a graduate student involved in Ocean Safety Research in the School of Maritime Studies at the Marine Institute. Preference will be given to an international student. The recipient must meet the minimum academic requirements for scholarship standing as defined by Memorial University of Newfoundland. This Scholarship will be awarded by the Associate Vice-President (Academic) and Dean, Graduate Studies on the recommendation of the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee.

Duke Marine Scholarship

The Duke Marine Scholarship at the Fisheries and Marine Institute was established in 2022, celebrating the company's expansion to Newfoundland and Labrador, where in their new office designers and engineers are working alongside the National Ship Building Strategy (NSS). Duke Marine is 100% Canadian owned and operated and has been providing highly skilled professionals to the shipbuilding and oil and gas industries for over twenty years. Duke Marine has built its reputation as a first-class recruitment company through its cornerstones of Trust, Relationships, and Experience, delivering the best possible experience and environment for clients and contractors. The Duke Marine Scholarship at the Fisheries and Marine Institute will be granted annually to a fulltime Canadian student, beyond first term, enrolled in the Marine Engineering Systems Design program or the Naval Architecture program at the Fisheries and Marine Institute. First priority will be given to Indigenous students. Second priority will be given to a student who self-identifies as a woman, or as a gender-diverse person

or as a black or racialized person. This scholarship will be granted by the Fisheries and Marine Institute Scholarship Committee.

Ed Bowdring Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established by the friends and colleagues of Ed Bowdring as a memorial to an exceptional photographer who has left a valuable photo record of the people of the land and the sea.

The scholarship will be valued at a portion of the interest on the endowment and will be given annually. It is awarded to a student who demonstrates a creative use of video or still photography as part of his or her studies, or develops an innovative media-related project for the benefit of rural Newfoundland and Labrador.

ESRI Canada Higher Education Scholarship in GIS

The ESRI Canada GIS Scholarship is a national scholarship given by ESRI Canada recognizing MI for a strong, multidisciplinary focus on Geographic Information Systems (GIS) in MI's new Joint Diploma/Degree in Ocean Mapping.

Frank Dopplinger Memorial Scholarship

This endowed scholarship was established by the family of Frank Dopplinger, former Chairman of the Fishing Industry Advisory Board, as a memorial of his contributions to the Newfoundland Fishing Industry. It is awarded annually to a student in a fisheries-related program based on academic performance.

Hazen A. Russell Scholarship in Fisheries

Two scholarships will be awarded to qualified second and third year students in fisheries programs. The trust fund is a donation by the family of the late Hazen A. Russell, who made a major contribution to the development of the Newfoundland fishing industry.

These scholarships honour the memory of an outstanding businessman whose success was due in no small measure to his commitment to quality control and technical innovation.

Kjell Henriksen Scholarship

Endowed scholarship by the widow of the late President of the Canadian Saltfish Corporation, in memory of her husband, awarded annually to second or third-year diploma students and advanced diploma students in the School of Fisheries.

Marine Atlantic Scholarship

This Scholarship was established by Marine Atlantic Inc. to support students who will be entering the marine industry and aims to foster interest in this industry from equity-deserving groups. Valued at \$2,000 each, four (4) Scholarships will be awarded annually to students at the Marine Institute of Memorial University of Newfoundland. Two (2) Scholarships will be awarded to students in either the second or third year of the Nautical Science program and two (2) Scholarships shall be awarded to students in either the second or third year of the Marine Engineering program. Preference will be given to students who self-identify as female, or as gender-diverse, or as a Black or racialized person, Indigenous, or people with a permanent disability. Students can demonstrate their Indigenous identity through provision of a membership card and by providing a letter from a leader in their Indigenous community (for example, an elder or local leader) that they are claimed by their Indigenous community. Three (3) Scholarships (two (2) in Nautical Science and one (1) in Marine Engineering) will be awarded during the Fall ceremony, and one (1) Scholarship (in Marine Engineering) will be awarded during the

Winter ceremony. The recipient must meet the minimum academic requirements for scholarship standing as defined by the University. The Scholarship will be awarded by the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee.

Marine Institute Faculty Association Scholarship

The Marine Institute Faculty Association Scholarship Fund was established through a collective gift from Marine Institute faculty that was raised over many years while faculty were members of the Marine Institute Faculty Association. Most of the original contributing faculty members have since become Marine Institute retirees.

Valued at a portion of the income on the endowment the scholarship will be given annually at the Marine Institute Winter/Spring scholarship ceremony to a fulltime student with scholarship standing studying beyond first year in a three or four year technical program at the Marine Institute. The scholarship will be awarded by the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee.

Marine Institute Students' Union Scholarship

This scholarship was established by a generous donation from the Marine Institute Students' Union (MISU). Incorporated in 1991, MISU is responsible for representing students in undergraduate programs at Marine Institute. Valued at a portion on the income on the endowment two undergraduate scholarships of equal value will be awarded annually (one in Fall semester and one in Winter semester to students enrolled in a program that is represented by MISU. First preference will be given to a candidate who participates actively in the Marine Institute student union community. Second preference will be given to a student in financial need. The recipient must meet the minimum academic requirements for scholarship standing as defined by Memorial University of Newfoundland. The scholarship will be awarded by the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee.

Marine Safety Scholarship at the Fisheries and Marine Institute

The Marine Safety Scholarship at the Fisheries and Marine Institute is valued at a portion of the income on the endowment. One or more scholarships will be awarded annually to students attending the Fisheries and Marine Institute of Memorial University of Newfoundland.

The recipients must meet the academic requirements for a scholarship as defined by the University. One or more of the scholarships may be awarded based on faculty nomination of demonstrated learning in marine safety excellence. The scholarship will be awarded by the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee.

Miller Graduate Scholarship at the Marine Institute

This scholarship was established by Dr. Hugh Miller, Memorial University alumnus, retired professor and administrator and long-time supporter of student success. Shortly after the Marine Institute (MI) joined Memorial University in 1992, Dr. Miller came to MI in 1994 as Associate Executive Director. During his tenure he led the transition of the academic governance at the Institute to within the university system and facilitated the Institute's expansion into degree offerings, such as the Bachelor of Maritime Studies in 1995 and the Bachelor of Technology in 1997 - each the first of its kind offered across Canadian universities, and also the Masters of Maritime Studies (Fisheries Resource Management) in 1997 - the university's first degree totally devoted to fisheries.

Valued at a portion of the income on the endowment, this scholarship will be given annually to a fulltime graduate student studying beyond first semester in a research-based masters program at the Marine Institute. The recipient must meet the minimum academic requirements for scholarship standing as defined by Memorial University of Newfoundland. This scholarship will be awarded as described below by the Associate Vice-President (Academic) and Dean of Graduate Studies on the recommendation of the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee.

Oceanex Scholarship

Oceanex is a company with vision to become one of the most successful transportation companies in Eastern Canada. The company has had a long standing relationship with the Marine Institute and Memorial University, working as a key partner in work term placement and graduate employment of seafaring students, and this scholarship reflects the desire to continue to foster this positive relationship.

The scholarships will be awarded in both the Fall and Spring scholarship ceremonies. The fall scholarship recipients will be Nautical Science and Marine Engineering students beyond first year; for the Spring scholarship, preference is for a Marine Engineering student who has completed their second sea phase in the fall semester. Students must meet the general scholarship eligibility criteria and have a superior work term evaluation.

Initial preference for the scholarship will be given to students who have completed a work term with Oceanex, with secondary preference given to a high-achieving student in Nautical Science or Marine Engineering. The scholarship will be awarded by the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee.

Pikalujak Fisheries Limited Partnership Scholarship

This Scholarship was established by the Pikalujak Fisheries Limited Partnership with a commitment of \$5,000 annually. Pikalujak Fisheries Limited Partnership is the owner of a Northern Shrimp Fishing License whose partnership consists of the Nunatsiavut Group of Companies (the economic arm of the Nunatsiavut Government), the Labrador Sea-2004 (owned by Steinar Engeset), and Ocean Prawns Canada Ltd. (owned by Kristian Jensen). The link between Pikalujak Fisheries Limited Partnership and the Marine Institute has developed over the course of the Marine Institute's extensive work in Labrador. This scholarship has been established, reflecting and further fostering the positive relationship between Pikalujak Fisheries Limited, the Nunatsiavut Government and the Marine Institute. Two scholarships of \$1,250 each will be awarded in the fall semester and two scholarships of \$1,250 each will be awarded in the winter semester. Initial preference will be given to a Marine Institute student who is a beneficiary of the Labrador Inuit Land Claims Agreement. Second, third and fourth preference will be given to an indigenous Marine Institute student from Newfoundland and Labrador (2nd), Atlantic Canada (3rd), or Canada (4th).

Ross and Irene Durnford Memorial Scholarship

This Scholarship was established by a generous donation from Ed Durnford in memory of his brother and sister, Ross and Irene Durnford, who both passed away in 2022. Given Ed's long and successful career in the School of Fisheries, this Scholarship honours his siblings while celebrating academically high achieving Food Safety students. Valued at \$600, the Scholarship will be awarded to a full-time student in the Food Safety program at the Fisheries and Marine Institute of Memorial University of Newfoundland. The Scholarship will be awarded in the Winter 2025 semester. The recipient must meet the minimum academic requirements for scholarship standing as defined by the University. The Scholarship will be awarded by the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee.

Samit & Reshma Sharma Graduate Scholarship in Fisheries Science

This Scholarship was established by a generous donation from the Samit & Reshma Sharma Foundation to recognize the historical and economic importance of the Fishery industry in Newfoundland and Labrador. Valued at a portion of the income on the endowment, it will be awarded annually to a full-time thesis – or major project based graduate student in fisheries science, marine biology, or a related field, whose work will enhance societal knowledge and understanding in rearing, breeding and harvesting marine animals in a sustainable way that promotes ecological balance. Preference will first be given to students of fisheries science and marine biology, although interested candidates from related, relevant fields may apply. The recipient must meet the minimum academic requirements for scholarship standing as defined by Memorial University of Newfoundland. This Scholarship will be awarded by the Associate Vice-President (Academic) and Dean of Graduate Studies, based on a

recommendation from the Awards and Medals Committee, we will receive up to two nominations from each of the Faculty of Science and the Marine Institute.

Samit & Reshma Sharma Graduate Scholarship in Ocean & Naval Architectural Engineering and Applied Ocean Technology

This scholarship was established by a generous donation from the Samit & Reshma Sharma Foundation to recognize one of the top-rated programs providing comprehensive education needed for the design, operation and maintenance of ocean-going systems at Memorial University. Valued at a portion of the income on the endowment, it will be awarded annually to a full-time thesis or major project-based graduate student in ocean and naval architectural engineering, or a related field, whose work will enhance societal knowledge and understanding of hydrodynamics, marine structures, underwater navigation, ocean environmental engineering, etc. Preference will first be given to students of ocean and naval architecture engineering, although interested candidates from related, relevant fields may apply. The recipient must meet the minimum academic requirements for scholarship standing as defined by Memorial University of Newfoundland.

Sidney A. Hann Memorial Scholarship

The Sidney A. Hann Memorial Scholarship honours the memory of Sidney Hann, a Marine Institute graduate and pioneer of the provincial and national fishing industry. The scholarship was awarded annually beginning 2012 through a collective gift from friends, family and industry and was endowed in 2022 through a gift from the Estate of William Fox. Valued at a portion of the income on the endowment, the scholarship will be awarded annually to a full-time student enrolled in a program within the School of Fisheries at the Marine Institute. Recipients must have graduated from high school in Newfoundland and Labrador and must meet the minimum academic requirements for scholarship standing as defined by Memorial University of Newfoundland. This scholarship will be awarded by the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee.

Steinar Engeset Bridge Watch Scholarship

The scholarship was established by a generous donation from Steinar Engeset who is originally from Norway and emigrated to Canada in 1966 where he built a successful career in the marine and fishing industry; he founded Newfound Trading Limited and later other ventures. He played a pivotal role in developing the Northern Shrimp Fishery and the Arctic Surf Clam fishery, collaborating with various partners to advance fishing technologies and sustainable practices in Atlantic Canada. His dedication to the fishing industry and heritage preservation has had a lasting impact on both sectors in Canada. Valued at \$1,500, two scholarships will be awarded to two students in the Bridge Watch program at the Fisheries and Marine Institute of Memorial University of Newfoundland; one scholarship will be awarded in the Fall semester and one will be awarded in the Spring Semester. The recipient must meet the minimum academic requirements for scholarship standing as defined by the University. The Scholarship will be awarded by the Marine Institute's Scholarship Committee.

Steinar Engeset Marine Engineering Scholarship

The scholarship was established by a generous donation from Steinar Engeset who is originally from Norway and emigrated to Canada in 1966 where he built a successful career in the marine and fishing industry; he founded Newfound Trading Limited and later other ventures. He played a pivotal role in developing the Northern Shrimp Fishery and the Arctic Surf Clam fishery, collaborating with various partners to advance fishing technologies and sustainable practices in Atlantic Canada. His dedication to the fishing industry and heritage preservation has had a lasting impact on both sectors in Canada. Valued at \$500, two scholarships will be awarded to two students in the Marine Engineering program at the Fisheries and Marine Institute of Memorial University of Newfoundland; one will be awarded in the Fall semester and one in the Spring Semester. academic requirements for scholarship standing as defined by the University. The Scholarship will be awarded by the Marine Institute's Scholarship Committee.

Steinar Engeset Women in Nautical Science Scholarship

This scholarship was established by a generous donation from Steinar Engeset, who is originally from Norway and emigrated to Canada in 1966 where he built a successful career in the marine and fishing industry; he founded Newfound Trading Limited and later other ventures. He played a pivotal role in developing the Northern Shrimp Fishery and the Arctic Surf Clam fishery, collaborating with various partners to advance fishing technologies and sustainable practices in Atlantic Canada. His dedication to the fishing industry and heritage preservation has had a lasting impact on both sectors in Canada. Valued at \$1,000 each, a scholarship will be awarded to each of two students identifying as female in the Nautical Science program at the Fisheries and Marine Institute of Memorial University of Newfoundland; one scholarship will be awarded in the Fall semester and one will be awarded in the Spring Semester. The recipients must meet the minimum academic requirements for scholarship standing as defined by the University. The Scholarship will be awarded by the Marine Institute's Scholarship Committee.

Tom Best Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established to honour the memory of Tom Best through generous gifts from his wife, Lynn Best, his five daughters, the Petty Harbour Fisherman's Co-operative Society and countless community members who have been positively impacted by Tom's leadership in the fisheries. Tom Best was a fiercely proud inshore fish harvester who dedicated his life's work to advocating for sustainable fisheries and communities. Chair of the Petty Harbour Fishermen's Committee and founding President of the Petty Harbour Fishermen's Co-operative, Tom also served on multiple local and national committees related to the fishing industry. Privileged to support others around the globe in their quest for sustainable fisheries and co-operative development, in 2012, he was awarded the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee medal. Valued at a portion of the income on the endowment, the scholarship will be awarded annually to a full-time student from Newfoundland and Labrador studying in the School of Fisheries at the Fisheries and Marine Institute. First priority is a student enrolled in the Master of Marine Studies (Fisheries Resource Management). Second priority is a student enrolled in the Master of Science in Fisheries Science (Fisheries Science and Technology) whose research is focused on sustainability, resource development or a line of research to enhance fisheries outreach or education in rural NL. The recipient must meet the minimum academic requirements for a scholarship as defined by the Fisheries and Marine Institute of Memorial University of Newfoundland. This scholarship will be awarded by the Dean, School of Graduate Studies on the recommendation of the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee. This scholarship requires applicants to complete an application form.

AWARDS AND BURSARIES Winter

Ernest G. Reid Family Bursary

This Bursary was established by a generous donation from Ernest G. Reid in memory of the Reid family who: sailed and were lost as mariners; were entrepreneurs or professionals; were otherwise occupied in working endeavours. Valued at a portion of the income on the endowment, it will be awarded annually to an undergraduate student in any program of any year at Marine Institute of Memorial University of Newfoundland. The recipient must demonstrate financial need as well as meet the minimum academic requirements for a bursary as defined by Memorial University of Newfoundland.

This Bursary will be awarded by the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee.

Ian J. Reid Award

This Award has been developed in memory of Ian J. Reid, an individual who contributed greatly to his community. He was a veteran of World War II and maintained an active naval connection, and also served his community in a volunteer capacity and numerous community organizations. He was a smart business leader and was delighted to be the first chair of the Canadian Centre for Fisheries Innovation. Valued at \$1,000 annually, the Award will be granted to an international graduate student who is completing their program on campus at the Fisheries and Marine Institute of Memorial University of Newfoundland. The recipient must meet the minimum academic requirements for an award as defined by the University. The Scholarship will be awarded by the Associate Vice-President (Academic) and Dean, Graduate Studies on the recommendation of the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee.

Melvin Freid Marine Safety Award

Donated by Alpha Beta Sigma Phi in remembrance of Mel Freid who lost his life in the Ocean Ranger disaster. This award is presented annually to a student who shows initiative and enterprise in the field of marine safety or to assist in a research project in marine safety.

Ocean Ranger Memorial Awards

On February 15, 1982, the Ocean Ranger Exploratory Drilling Platform sank, resulting in the tragic loss of the 84 crew members on board. As a memorial to this loss, an award program was established by the Ocean Ranger Disaster Fund. These awards are tenable by students who are entering or pursuing a post-secondary program of studies.

In selecting candidates, preference will be given to widows and lineal descendants (children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren etc.) of victims of the disaster. In the absence of eligible candidates from this group, the award may be given to other full time students at the discretion of the Ocean Ranger Award Selection Committee.

Public Service Credit Union Award for Leadership

This Award was established by a generous donation from the Public Service Credit Union who has been contributing to charitable organizations and scholarships since 2012 and is proud to be a supporter of the Marine Institute of Memorial University of Newfoundland. Valued at \$500 each, two (2) awards will be granted annually to two (2) undergraduate students at the Fisheries and Marine Institute who has been accepted to participate on a Marine Institute team related to a marine field of study, such as, but not limited to, the Marine Advanced Technology Education (MATE) Competition Team.

These awards will be granted to students who have displayed leadership and dedication to the team. Preference will be given to a student within the School of Ocean Technology. Recipients must meet the minimum academic requirements for an award as defined by Memorial University. The Award will be granted by the Fisheries and Marine Institute Scholarship Committee upon the Marine Institute Faculty nomination.

William Barter Memorial Bursary in Protecting Marine Environments

This bursary was established by a donation from Gloria Barter, daughter of William Barter. William Barter was born in 1907 and lived his entire life in Bay de Verde. He was a successful fisherman, committed community leader, and founding member and chairman of the Bay de Verde Co-operative. The co-op ran a general store and a cod liver factory, and supported local fisherman by providing loans which increased their autonomy and ability to negotiate the best price for their catch.

William Barter was a member of the first town council from 1950-51 and was particularly interested in community affairs, politics and the sustainability of the fishery. He was a lifelong learner and an avid reader. He believed education provided the ability to choose your path and achieve your goals, no matter what your occupation.

One bursary will be awarded annually to a student studying in the Marine Environmental Technology program. Preference will be given to a Canadian student who has completed the first year of the program. Preference will be given to a student with a particular interest in fisheries conservation. This bursary will be awarded in the winter/spring semester.

Bruce Wareham Memorial Award in Seafood Quality

The Bruce Wareham Memorial Award in Seafood Quality was established by Icewater Seafoods, the family-owned company Bruce formed in 2004 at the age of 61. During his 55 year career in the seafood industry, Bruce was a leader in innovation, adaptation to change, and quality-focused seafood processing. This award recognizes an individual enrolled in the second term of the Advanced Diploma in Food Safety at the Marine Institute who exhibits the characteristics that Bruce himself demonstrated and valued. The recipient must meet the minimum academic requirements for an award as defined by the University. The award will be granted by the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee, upon recommendation of a sub-committee of the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee - the Bruce Wareham Memorial Award in Seafood Quality Selection Committee. Applicants must complete the Bruce Wareham Memorial Award in Seafood Quality Award application.

Captain Howard Garland Award

The Captain Howard Garland Award was established by a one time donation from the Garland family. Born in Pushthrough, Newfoundland Howard moved to Nova Scotia at the tender age of 16 to pursue a career in the fishing industry, which became a 49 year career he was very proud of, becoming one of the youngest Captains in the industry at the time at the age of 26. He was employed with Ocean Choice International and co-captained a scallop factory freezer trawler. Howard enjoyed his career at sea and had a deep love for the ocean and fishing industry and hopes to inspire the next generation. This award recognizes an individual enrolled in their final year of Nautical Science who intends to go on to get their Captains License. The recipient must meet the minimum academic requirements for an award as defined by the University. The award will be granted by the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee, upon recommendation of a sub-committee of the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee - The Captain Howard Garland Award Selection Committee. Applicants must complete the Captain Howard Garland Award application.

Dale Howse Memorial Award

This endowed memorial award was established from a generous gift from The Howse Family. Valued at a portion of the income on the endowment, the award will be given annually to a student enrolled in a Marine Institute program who has demonstrated exceptional commitment to helping other students.

The award shall be based on academic performance and contribution to fellow students' academic and personal development. It is based on the recommendation of the Selection Committee and will be awarded by the Marine Institute Scholarship Committee.

Applicants must complete The Fry Family Foundation Graduate Student Leadership Awards at the Fisheries and Marine Institute Application.
